His leadership has enabled the hospital to significantly improve daily operations which was validated by the updated results. Because of his commitment, the hospital will be better able to serve the patients and families in the Brazos Valley.

Baldrige Champion: Dr. Montgomery was instrumental in this effort. His assembly of a fine team, writing synchronization, and constant monitoring of the results were critical to their success. The Baldrige Champion has to continually evaluate and constructively address the creative tension throughout the process. As with most organizations, success brings new opportunities and will bring to the front naysayers who were not actively involved. They will try to stop the progress and return to their previous comfortable state.

Baldrige Examiners: St. Joseph Health System sent a number of people to become Examiners with Quality Texas. Because of this commitment, the organization had people who really understood the criticality of working with the criteria for the long term success of the facility. Additionally, the organization trained each of their supervisors and leaders in the Baldrige approaches and in how to address the criteria.

Finally, the organization stepped up to the plate and hit a home run for medical care facilities in Texas. They are now the standard bearers. Their commitment to patients, families, and employees, their commitment to their vision and mission, along with strong values, will serve them well as they pursue the Malcolm Baldrige National Quality Award this next year.
